UPHOLDING FAMILIES

Sara* was thrown into an emotional turmoil when her husband was incarcerated in 2018. It did not help that she was suffering from a mental health condition and had to care for her 4-year-old daughter, Sofia*, alone. Sara struggled to put up a brave front for her daughter even though she was surrounded by darkness. Desperate for help, she turned to The Salvation Army Prison Support Services – Kids In Play (PSS-KIP) programme for assistance.

When Sara initially joined PSS-KIP's Caregivers Support Group, she was afraid of sharing her experiences. As she continued to participate in more sessions, she began to share her thoughts and feelings, which helped her to find comfort and draw strength from others.

As an only child, Sofia often kept to herself during PSS-KIP's initial EMPower group sessions for children. With positive encouragement from the staff and volunteers, she slowly opened up and enjoyed making new friends of all ages.

Sara and Sofia have never missed any of our activities. They look forward to every Family Bonding Programme, where they can meet Sofia's father in the prison, without any physical barrier between them. During our Children's Day Programme in 2020, Sofia was thrilled to have connected with her father via Zoom; showing her drawings, singing songs to him, and exchanging their love for each other.

Though faced with uncertainties of what the future may bring, Sara is glad to have found more stability in her marriage. She credits The Salvation Army's support in enabling her and her husband to communicate more effectively and resolve their differences.

2018年，*莎拉的丈夫入狱被监禁之后，她顿时崩溃。雪上加霜的是莎拉本身就患有精神疾病，加上得独自照料年仅四岁的女儿苏菲，肩上的负担变得沉重许多。为了女儿，莎拉只好在人前强装坚强，尽管内心已被幽暗的情绪笼罩着。在彷徨无助的情况下，她向救世军监狱支援服务——亲子乐项目寻求援助。

最初，当莎拉参加照料者支援小组时，她不太愿意跟其他人分享自己的经验。当她参加了多次小组聚会后，慢慢开始跟其他人分享她的想法和感受。这有助于她得到心灵上的慰藉，也让她从其他人身上找到力量。身为独生女，苏菲刚参加专为儿童举办的小组活动时，并不十分合群。在本军职员和志愿者的积极鼓励下，她渐渐敞开心扉，并且享受跟不同年龄的儿童做朋友。

莎拉和苏菲从不缺席本军的任何活动。她们期待参加每一次的家庭团聚活动。在这个项目下，她们可以跟在狱中服刑的苏菲的爸爸在没有任何阻隔的情况下面对面见面。在本军的2020年儿童节活动中，苏菲通过Zoom视像会议跟爸爸见面，这让她激动不已。她兴奋地透过电脑视频向爸爸展示自己画的图画、唱歌给他听，并向对方表达对彼此的关爱。

尽管未来充满了未知数，莎拉庆幸她能稳住自己的婚姻。她将这一切归功于救世军的支持，使她能更有效地跟丈夫沟通，化解彼此的分歧。

BACK TO SCHOOL



Prison Support Services - Kids In Play provides professional and practical support to children of incarcerated parents as we journey with them through the difficult period of separation. Before the new school term kicked off, we started preparing back-to-school kits to ensure that our children are well prepared for a great start in 2021.

To lessen the financial burden of our families, we gave out 33 refurbished laptops and 180 back-to-school kits which included essentials such as school bags, stationeries, shoes, and bookstore and supermarket vouchers. We are very thankful to our sponsors and donors who have made this possible and for providing the resources to help our children navigate the new school year.



Sojourn - SGcare Community Help Centre

To bolster our efforts in supporting the male migrant workers community, we recently opened The Salvation Army Sojourn - SGcare Community Help Centre in Sungei Tengah Lodge.
